This practical experience is supported with various educational visits under every subject. The college has to its credit appreciable results since inception and meritorious students who have excelled in MNC/MSBPNE, and MUHS examination.

The placement of the students after passing is 100%. The diploma, UG and PG degree holders of the institution are employed all over the state, in the country and abroad. They are employed in General, specialty and super specialty hospitals in State, primary health centers under NRHM,

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G.N.M (DIPLOMA IN NURSING) - 3 YEARS

1) ADMISSION CRITERIA:

- Age- Minimum age for admission will be 17 years respectively, as on 31st December of year. There is no age for ANM/LHV.
- Minimum education eligibility criteria for admission to GNM:
 - 10+2 with English and must have obtained a minimum of 40% at the qualifying examination and English individually from any recognized board. Candidates are also eligible from State Open School recognized by State Government and National Institute of Open School (NIOS) recognized by Central Government. However Science is preferable. Three (core elective) subject marks may be taken for calculating the percentage of marks excluding the marks in English. Also, it has to be ensured the candidate has pass marks in English.
 - 10+2 with English having 40% of marks in vocational ANM course from the school recognized by Indian Nursing Council.
 - 10+2 with English having 40% of marks in Vocational Stream Health care Science from a recognized CBSE board/State/Centre.
 - Registered ANM with pass marks.
- **Reservation Policy**
 - For disabled candidates: 3% Disability reservation to be considered with a *disability of locomotor* to the tune of 40% to 50% of the lower extremity, and other eligibility criteria with regard to age and qualification will be same as prescribed for each nursing program.
 - 5% of total, marks is relaxed for reserve category students.
 - Any other reservation as per the State Government.
 - 10% supernumerary seats for foreign students shall be reserved. This supernumerary quota of foreign students will not be filled by any other quota/general seats.
 - Admission of students shall be once in a year.
 - Students shall be medically fit.
 - The admission criteria given by statutory bodies are applicable from time to time.

Eligibility criteria for admission to examination of G.N.M:-

1. Shall have one regular examination followed by supplementary examination in a year.
2. She/he has completed not less than 11 months of respective academic year.
3. A candidate must have minimum of 80% attendance (irrespective of the kind of absence) in theory and practical in each subject for appearing for examination.
4. A candidate must secure 50% marks in internal assessment separately in each theory and practical.
5. The record of practical experience must be complete.
6. The candidate has to pass theory and practical exam separately in each of the paper.
7. If candidate fails in theory or practical he has to reappear for both.
8. The diploma shall not be awarded to the student till she/he has completed the clinical/field requirements.
9. The candidate must complete the course within 6 years from the year of admission.

B.SC.NURSING- : 4 YEARS (8 SEMESTERS)**1) ADMISSION CRITERIA: -**

1. The minimum age for admission shall be 17 years on or before 31st Dec. of the year of admission.
2. 10 + 2 passed out from recognized board under AISSCE/CBSE/ICSE/SSCE/HSCE or other equivalent board, 10 + 2 examination in Science conducted by National Institute of Open School.
3. A candidate belonging to open category must have obtained not less than 45% marks in Physics, Chemistry, Biology subject taken together at the HSC or equivalent examination.
4. The candidates belonging to SC/ST or other backward classes, the marks obtained in PCB taken together in qualifying examination be 40%.
5. English is a compulsory subject in 10+2 for being eligible for admission to BSc N.
6. Candidate shall be medically fit.
7. MH Nursing CET Exam of particular year as applicable.
8. The admission criteria given by statutory bodies are applicable from time to time.

5. The candidate must complete the course within 8 years from the year of admission.

MAHARASHTRA PROHIBITION OF RAGGING ACT

As per the provision of Maharashtra Act XXXIII, known as 'Maharashtra Prohibition of Ragging Act of 1999' students indulging in ragging can be punished by under the act resulting in suspension, exclusion from the college and imprisonment.

The word 'Ragging' means the act causing, inducting, compelling or forcing a student, whether by way of a practical joke or otherwise, to do any act which detract from human dignity or violets his person or exposes him to injurious him or by using criminal force to him or by holding out to him any threat of such intimidation, wrongful confinement, injury or the use of criminal forces'

Forms of ragging:

Ragging is found to take the following forms (the list only indicative and not exhaustive)

Crisp orders: to address senior as 'Sir/Madam' and 'Sister/Brother' (for nursing field)

- To perform mass drills,
- To copy class notes for the senior,
- To serve various errands,
- To do menial jobs for seniors,
- To ask/answer vulgar questions,
- To look pornographic pictures to 'shock the fresher's out of their innocence'
- To force to drink alcohol, scalding tea etc...
- To force to acts this can lead to physical injury/mental torture or death,
- To strip, kiss etc. to do other obscenities.

Punishments:

While the first 08 types of punishment can be awarded by the appropriate authority of college itself, the last punishment can be awarded only by court of law.

1. Cancellation of admission.
2. Suspension from attending classes.
3. Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits.
4. Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process.
5. Withholding result.
6. Debarring from representing the institution in any state, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
7. Expulsion from the hostel and from institution for the period varying from 6 months to a year.
8. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution fine up to Rs. 25000/-
9. Rigorous imprisonment up to 03 years.

Any incident of ragging reported to taken place outside the college campus, without any enquiry, the complaint shall be forwarded to the police.

Note: Ragging is strictly prohibited in college/hostel/clinical. If any student is found guilty shall be entitled to the above punishment as appropriate.
